Doug Millard has joined an organization called **Imagine One Day (i1d)**, which builds schools for children in Ethiopia. Doug, his son, Adam and Adam's wife are part of a group of 15 that will be going to Ethiopia in September. In order to go, they must pay their own way and the team is obligated to raise \$100,000 toward building schools.

To raise money Doug is running the equivalent distance from Cornwall to Toronto (450 km.). He will be running at lunch hour 2 and in other spare time he has, with the goal of completing the run in 100 days.
