In order to go, they must pay their own way and the team is obligated to raise \$100,000 toward building schools. Presently they are working in the Tigray region of Ethiopia. To raise money Doug is running the equivalent distance from Cornwall to Toronto (450 km.). He will be running in his spare time, with the goal of completing the run in 100 days.
